PRODUCER NANCY SPIELBERG TAKES THE SPOTLIGHT AT JEWISH FEDERATION WOMEN'S PHILANTHROPY SPRING EVENT

Remarks by Nancy Spielberg, Hollywood producer and sister of famed director Steven Spielberg, will highlight this year's Women's Philanthropy Spring Event. The event will feature an exclusive screening and discussion of Spielberg's documentary film, "Above and Beyond," and is presented by the Women's Philanthropy Division of the Jewish Federation of Greater Pittsburgh in appreciation of women's philanthropic giving. Women's Philanthropy invites women who have donated at least \$1,000 to the Jewish Federation of Greater Pittsburgh's 2015 Annual Campaign, or young women (age 45 and under) who make a minimum commitment of \$365, to attend. The event will be held Monday, April 20, at 7 p.m. at the Manor Theatre in Squirrel Hill (1729 Murray Ave., Pittsburgh, Pa. 15217). Couvert is \$10 per person.

In addition to Ms. Spielberg's remarks, the evening will feature the presentation of the Natalie Novick Woman of Philanthropy Award to Marlene Silverman. All attendees are encouraged to bring toiletry items that the Women's Philanthropy Division will use to create Mother's Day gifts for the Squirrel Hill Community Food Pantry. Desserts and wine will be served, and dietary laws will be observed.

By making a financial contribution to the Annual Campaign of the Jewish Federation of Greater Pittsburgh, each attendee makes an impact of her own. The Annual Campaign provides essential, unrestricted dollars to 10 beneficiary agencies that fight poverty and support families in Pittsburgh and around the world. Many of these programs, such as the Jewish Community Center, benefit Jewish and non-Jewish Pittsburgh.

Spielberg's film "Above and Beyond" is a documentary telling the story of a group of Jewish American pilots who fought in Israel's war for independence just three years after returning home from World War II. In secret, and at great personal risk, they smuggled planes out of the United States, trained behind the Iron Curtain in Czechoslovakia and flew for Israel, playing an incisive role in Israel's victory. As members of Machal — "volunteers from abroad" — this ragtag band of brothers not only turned the tide of the war, they also embarked on personal journeys of discovery and renewed Jewish pride. "Above and Beyond" is their story.

In addition to producing "Above and Beyond," Spielberg was an executive producer of the 2011 documentary "Elusive Justice: The Search for Nazi War Criminals," which is narrated by Candice Bergen, and producer of "Mimi and Donna" (2014), a documentary about aging caregivers of people with intellectual disabilities.
